APPENDIX 2

Cllr R Shepherd-DuBey, Borough Councillors Report:

Hatch Farm Dairies: Nothing has happened over the summer, I am waiting for an update. As of August they have not signed their S106 agreement. This means most likely that construction is unlikely to start before Summer 2017 at the earliest because it takes 2 years lead time to get the High Tension Electric cables they require to bury the electric lines.

Winnersh Bypass no news here either. The Borough has not yet purchased the land between Longdon Drive and the Reading Rd. This means the Bypass is unlikely to be built until 2018 at the earliest and more likely 2019 or 2020.

Northern Distribution Road, The designation of a Sang of land near the junctions of the M4 and A329M in Eastern Winnersh, potentially changes the route of the road to come down Toutley and close to Monkey Mates, a business located in Winnersh. The residents in Eastern Winnersh off Old Forrest Rd prefer the route going through the allotments, while the residents in the rest of Winnersh either have expressed no preference or preferred the Route down Old Forrest Rd. Either route is likely not to be built for 10 years because of delays in Network Rail permission to cross their tracks. This may result in construction traffic and new Northern SDL residents on Old Forrest Rd and more traffic on the Reading Rd and more pressure on Winnersh Crossroads.

Winnersh Crossroads seem to operate reasonably better than in the recent past, but that is anecdotal, not backed by statistics or traffic speed records.

The works to upgrade the Signalling at Showcase roundabout is still scheduled for November 2014. The more problematic works on the other half of the A329M overpass are scheduled for Summer holidays 2015.

The park and ride move has been tendered by Reading Borough Council, but no date is set. The move must be started before the end of the 2014/15 fiscal year to keep the grant from central government.

The fencing in the existing park and ride was due to be removed by a subcontractor, but they failed to complete the work. After emails to the Wokingham Highways Department they were in contact with the major contractor to get the work done.

The often delayed work on the bridge over the tracks on Robin Hood Lane seems to be almost finished finally. There have been numerous complaints from residents about the lack of speed on a project that was originally scheduled to take 10 days but seemed to have dragged on.

Winnersh Meadows bridge over the pond repair contract is in the process of getting estimates and tendering for the work. No ETA for completion is available at this time.

Winnersh Triangle owners have been working with residents who claimed damage to their properties caused by the construction.

The Arbor Lane Development has been delayed again due to drainage and flooding issues, between WBC and the developer.
