WINNERSH PARK & RIDE



Great news! Following a successful Saturday-only trial, Winnersh Triangle park and ride 500 is returning on Monday 19 August running up to every 15 minutes Monday to Saturday.

With an average journey time of around 12 - 15 minutes to Central Reading, our Winnersh Triangle park&ride buses will take advantage of the new London Road bus lane, providing a fast way to and from town helping you avoiding sitting in traffic or having to find a parking spot.

Winnersh Triangle Park & ride will be getting a brand new look and feel for the route shortly too, as well as fully refreshed gas-powered buses featuring comfortable seating, USB charging and free wifi allowing you to relax and recharge as we take you to and from Central Reading. In the meantime, a fleet of comfortable temporary buses will be running on the route.

Adult single tickets are just £2 and a return is £4, with boost tickets costing just £1.50 for a single or £2.80 return. Parking costs £1 all day and can be purchased as you board from the driver. You will need to register your vehicle at the machines in the car park before boarding.

Buses will be running up to every 15 minutes between 6.45am and 6pm Monday to Friday and between 8am and 6pm on Saturdays.

THE GLASS COMPANY

Did you know that The Glass Company, based in Winnersh, provide a doorstep glass collection service throughout Wokingham Borough?

After facing challenges with glass recycling as new home-owners, The Glass Company was created to improve household eco-friendliness and ease the recycling process for consumers in a society where glass usage is increasing but recycling rates are low.

The aim of The Glass Company is to become the top glass recycling company in the UK. Operating throughout Wokingham Borough, 10% of all profits are donated to local charities.

Prices start from just £6.99 for a single monthly box collection within 30km of Wokingham. Winnersh Parish Council will receive 10% of profits from any Winnersh residents that sign up to the service and this will be donated to a local charity.

ALLOTMENTS

Do you want to grow your own fruit & veg?

Do you want to get out in the fresh air?

Do you want to increase your physical exercise?

Then why not consider taking on an allotment!

Winnersh Parish Council leases an area of land from WBC WBC on Woodward Close (behind the Royal British Legion) for the provision of allotments to Winnersh and Sindlesham residents.

The site was created in 2019 following the closure of the old site to make way for the new Northern Distributor Road.

There are a mixture of over 100 full and half plots and the site is secured with keypad entry at the vehicle and pedestrian entrances. The site has numerous facilities including taps to enable efficient watering of crops, composting toilets and solar sheds so tenants can charge their battery powered tools or mobile phones and even make a cup of tea while they chat with neighbouring plot holders!

The physical benefits of regular spells of gardening help plot holders to keep fit even if they have sedentary jobs. Getting outside is also good for us. Spending just 15-90 minutes a day out in the summer sunshine can build up your levels of immune boosting vitamin D.

If managed properly, an allotment can produce enough food to supplement a family's weekly shop, with fresh fruit and vegetables over the year.
